4 William IV – Chapter 28

An Act to alter the Division Line between the Counties of York and Carleton. Passed 22d March 1834.

Whereas the Line at present established between the Counties of York and Carleton has been found inconvenient;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the passing this of Act, the Division Line between the Counties of York and Carleton shall be as follows: Commencing at the Monument situate at the Source of the Cheputnetikook [Chiputneticook], and running by the true Meridian a due East Course till it strikes Eel river; thence following the several Courses of the said Eel River, along its Northern Bank, to the Point where the upper Line of Lot Number Forty six, granted to Isaac Attwood, intersects the said Eel River (such Intersection of said upper Line of Lot Number Forty six, being the Intersection nearest and most contiguous to the River Saint John); thence along the said upper Line of Lot Number Forty six aforesaid to the River Saint John; thence crossing the said River Saint John to meet the upper Line of Lands granted to Matthew Phillips; thence along the said Line North Forty five Degrees East, by the Magnet of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety, and a Continuation thereof, until it strikes the Division Line between the County of Northumberland and the said Counties of York and Carleton.
