7 William IV – Chapter 46 (Session 1)

An Act to incorporate The Salmon Falls Bridge Company. Passed 1st March 1837.

Whereas as the erection of a good and sufficient Bridge across the Saint Croix River at the Salmon Falls would be a great public benefit and convenience: And whereas the undermentioned persons are willing at their own cost and charges to complete the same,

- I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That James Rait, James Allanshaw, Thomas Wyer, John Wilson, Harris Hatch, John M'Master, and their associates, their successors and assigns, shall be and they are hereby erected into a Company, and declared to be a body politic and corporate by the name of The Salmon Falls Bridge Company, and by that name shall have all the general powers and privileges made incident to a Corporation by an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, made and passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to prescribe general regulations in respect to Corporations."
- II. And be it enacted, That the capital stock of the said Corporation shall consist of the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds, the whole amount of the said stock to be divided into one hundred shares, of twenty five pounds each, to be paid in such proportions as the directors may think necessary.
- III. Provided always and be it enacted, That unless the said Bridge be erected and opened for the use of the public (subject to the rates of tollage that may be levied by the proprietors thereof) on or before the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, the operation of this Act shall cease and the existence of the said Corporation be terminated.
