1 Victoria – Chapter 15

**An Act to alter the times for the appointment of Sheriffs and Supervisors of Great Roads. Passed 9th March 1838.**

Whereas by an Act made and passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the better regulating of the office of Sheriff in this Province," it is provided that annual appointments to that office shall be made on the first Tuesday in April in each year: And whereas the time for such appointments is found to be inconvenient, Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the Sheriffs of the several Counties in this Province (except the Sheriff for the City and County of Saint John) shall after the present year one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight, be appointed on the first Tuesday in March in each and every year instead of the first Tuesday in April in each year: Provided always, that the said Sheriffs so to be appointed shall not enter upon the duties of their respective office until the first Tuesday in April, and shall continue in office until the first Tuesday in April next ensuing.

II. And whereas by an Act made and passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act relating to the great roads of communication through this Province," it is provided that the appointment of Supervisors shall be made in the first week in April in each and every year: And whereas the time for making such appointments is found to be inconvenient; Be it enacted, That the respective Supervisors of great roads shall after the present year one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight be appointed on the first Tuesday in March in each and every year instead of the first week in April in each year.
