

Acts of the General Assembly of Her Majesty's Province of New-Brunswick passed in the year 1838. Fredericton, NB: John Simpson, Printer to the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, 1838.

1 Victoria – Chapter 29

An Act in addition to an Act intituled “An Act to make more effectual regulations relating to Pilots within this Province,” so far as regards the County of Charlotte.” Passed 9th March 1838.

Whereas branch Pilots are now by law not entitled to any pilotage from any ship or vessel outward bound, from any port or place within the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy, refusing to receive the same: And whereas it is right that such Pilots should receive half Pilotage from such ships or vessels so refusing to receive them; for remedy whereof,

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, if any branch Pilot for the County of Charlotte, shall in any case make it appear that he has discharged his duty by offering his services to pilot any ship or vessel that shall depart outward bound, from any port or place with the County of Charlotte, in proper time and place, agreeably to the regulations which may be made by virtue of the above recited Act made and passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to make more effectual regulations relating to Pilots within this Province,” and the master of such ship or vessel not having any other Pilot on board, authorised to act as such under and by virtue of the said recited Act, shall not employ such Pilot so offering his service as aforesaid, for the Pilotage of such ship or vessel, in the same manner and in all respects subject to the same provisions as Pilots are by the provisions of the hereinbefore in part recited Act, who attend upon inward bound vessels.
