1 Victoria – Chapter 31

An Act to enlarge and define the Boundaries of the Parish of Woodstock. Passed 9th March 1838.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That all the lands now included in the present Parish of Woodstock, which lies between the said Parish and a line commencing on the westwardly bank or shore of the river Saint John, at the northeast angle of lot number forty six granted to Benjamin P. Griffith and others, and thence running along the northerly boundary line of the said lot and its prolongation westwardly to the south west bank or shore of the Maduxnikick [Meduxnekeag] stream, and thence along the said bank or shore and the southwardly bank or shore of the south branch of the said Meduxnikick [Meduxnekeag] stream until it intersects the western boundary line of the Province, thence along said boundary line due south until it strikes the monument, shall be annexed to and form a part of the said Parish of Woodstock, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
