1 Victoria – Chapter 34

An Act to repeal an Act, intituled "An Act for erecting a part of the Parishes of Saint Mary's and Douglas in the County of York, into a separate and distinct Town or Parish." Passed 9th March 1838.

Whereas an Act made and passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for erecting a part of the Parishes of Saint Mary's and Douglas in the County of York, into a separate and distinct Town and Parish," has been found not to answer the good purpose intended thereby, and it is deemed expedient to repeal the same;

- I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the said recited Act be and the same is hereby repealed: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall in any wise prevent or interfere with the recovery of any Parish or County assessment, which may have been made or ordered by the Court of general Sessions of the Peace of the said County of York under the said recited Act.
- II. And be it further enacted, That all Town and Parish officers which may have been appointed under and by virtue of the said Act shall continue in office, with full powers as such until others shall be respectively appointed by the general Sessions of the Peace for the said County at the usual period provided by law for the appointment of such Town and Parish officers.
