10 Victoria – Chapter 52

**An Act to repeal the fifth Section of an Act, intituled *An Act to provide for sick and disabled Seamen, not being Tempers, belonging to the Province*, and to appropriate for a particular service a part of the surplus fund collected under that and other Acts. Passed 14th April 1847.**

I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the fifth Section of an Act made and passed in the sixtieth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled *An Act to provide for sick and disabled Seamen, not being Paupers*, belonging to the Province, be and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And be it enacted, That there be allowed and paid out of the surplus fund remaining in the hands of the Province Treasurer, collected under the Actor Acts now or heretofore in force in this Province to provide for sick and disabled Seamen at Saint John, to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being, the sum of one thousand pounds to be applied and appropriated towards building and establishing a "Sailors' Home" in the City of Saint John, at such site or place as Commissioners already appointed or hereafter to be appointed for the purpose, may determine, any thing contained in the second section of an Act otherwise appropriating such monies, made and passed in the third year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled *An Act to alter an Act to provide for sick and disabled Seamen, not being Paupers, belonging to the Province, and to provide Buildings for the accommodation of the same*, to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. And be it enacted, That the before-mentioned sum of money shall be paid by the Treasurer out of the monies of the said surplus fund, by Warrant of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Executive Council.
