11 Victoria – Chapter 26

An Act to explain an Act, intituled *An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace of the several Counties in this Province for the time being to receive for public uses Grants of Land lying in their respective Counties, and to regulate the Commons belonging to the several Townships or Parishes within the same.* Passed 30th March 1848.

Whereas doubts have arisen whether under the powers of the second section of an Act, made and passed in the twenty sixth year of the Reign of His Majesty George the Third, intituled *An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace of the several Counties in this Province for the time being to receive for public uses Grants of Land lying in their respective Counties, and to regulate the Commons belonging to the several Townships or Parishes within the same*, the Justices of the Peace in the several Counties are able and capable in Law to bring and maintain any action at Law for the recovery of the Rents of any Land held by them in trust, and leased by virtue of the provisions of the said recited Act, or on account of any holding or agreement in respect of any such Land so held in trust as aforesaid;

Be it therefore declared and enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the Justices of the Peace in such Counties shall by the style and title of "The Justices of the Peace of the County (or City and County of _____)," be able and capable in Law to bring and maintain any action for, and to sue for, recover and receive the rents, issues and profits of any Lands received and retained by them in trust, and leased by them for any term of years under the provisions of the said recited Act, or on account of any holding or agreement in respect of any such Land so receive and retained in trust as aforesaid.
