11 Victoria – Chapter 38

An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the County of Carleton to pay certain expenses incurred in preserving the Peace in said County. Passed 30th March 1848.

Whereas the Justices of the Peace of the County of Carleton incurred a heavy expense in preserving the Peace in the said County in July last, a large part of which it is proposed to pay by a Legislative Grant, and the remainder by assessment upon the County of Carleton;

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the Justices of the Peace for the County of Carleton, at any General Sessions of the Peace hereafter holden, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make such rate and assessment of any sum not exceeding five hundred and ninety one pounds ten shillings, in such sums and at such times as they in their discretion may deem necessary, for defraying the expenses incurred in preserving the Peace in the said County in July last, to be assessed, levied, collected and paid agreeably to any Law in force for collecting and levying County or Parish Rates.

II. And be it enacted, That notwithstanding the provisions of any Act or Acts now in force for levying, assessing and collecting County and Parish Rates, the Justices of the General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Carleton shall have full power and authority, if they in their discretion shall see fit, to assess one fifth of any assessment to be made under this Act, upon the polls of the inhabitants of the said County.
