13 Victoria - Chapter 13 Private or Personal Acts
An Act to incorporate the King's County Union Agricultural Society. Passed 11th April 1850.
Whereas James Peters, President, Walter B. Scovil and James Dann, Vice-Presidents, Nathan Ganong, James Perkins, Jeremiah Mabec, Senior, and Seth Eeb, Directors, and other Inhabitants and Landowners in the Parishes of Springfield and Kingston, have formed themselves into a Society for the promotion and improvement of Agriculture in said Parishes; and it would be more beneficial to the interests of said Society, and enable them more effectually to carry out the intention and promote the object thereof, if the said Society were incorporated;
I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That James Peters, and the Directors, and all such other persons who are now or who may hereafter be admitted members of the said Society, their associates and successors, be and they are hereby erected into a Body Corporate, under the name and style of "The King's County Union Agricultural Society," for the purpose of promoting and encouraging Agriculture, and rural and domestic economy and industry, within the said Parishes, and for these purposes shall have and enjoy all general powers made incident to Corporations by Act of Assembly of this Province.
II. And be it enacted, That there shall be a general meeting of the members of said Corporation, to be held annually, at or near Mr. Moses Dru's, in the said County, on the second Tuesday in October; at which annual meeting there shall be chosen thirteen Directors; which said Directors, when so elected, shall choose from their body one President, two Vice-Presidents, and shall also appoint a Secretary and Treasurer from among the members of said Society; which said officers, when so chosen and appointed, shall continue in office for one year, or until others are chosen and appointed in their room; in the choice of which Directors each member shall have one vote for each Director, and every member may vote by proxy, provided such proxy be a member, and personally produce a sufficient authority in writing from his constituent.
