13 Victoria – Chapter 17 New Brunswick Local Acts

An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the County of Northumberland for the time being to receive the title of and hold a piece of Land in the Town of Newcastle, for the use of a Grammar School in the said Town. Passed 26th April 1850.

Whereas it is desirable that the title to the piece or parcel of Land situate in the Town of Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, hereinafter described, should be vested in the Justices of the Peace for the aforesaid County, in trust for the use of a Grammar School in the said Town;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, the following piece of Land, being a parcel of the Public Lot on which the Court House and Gaol are built in the Parish of Newcastle, and distinguished in the Town Plat or Plan as the Lot number twenty in Block letter C, and abutted and bounded as described in the Plan on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County, the said Lot being of the width of one hundred and fourteen feet fronting on Duke Street, and eighty six feet on Regent Street, which said Lot, piece or parcel of Land was purchased by sundry inhabitants of the said Town for the use of a Grammar School, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the Justices of the Peace for the County of Northumberland, and their Successors, for and in trust for the use, benefit and advantage of a Grammar School in the Town of Newcastle, for the instruction of Youth; provided always, that the said Justices shall not appoint any Trustees or Teachers, or interfere in the management of the said School in any way.
