13 Victoria – Chapter 20 New Brunswick Local Acts

An Act to enable the Commissioner of Highways to establish a Public Road two rods wide across the Great Marsh in the Parish of Hopewell, in the County of Albert. Passed 26th April 1850.

Whereas it is deemed advisable to establish a Public and Common Highway from the Main Road in Hopewell to and across the Great Marsh in Hopewell to the Shepody River, along the private Road on the line between William A. Peck and the Estate of Eady Hoar, deceased, and a prolongation thereof to the said River; and to avoid the great expense of establishing such Road four rods wide,

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the Commissioners of Highways for the said Parish be and they are hereby authorized to lay out such Highway two rods wide, but subject in all other respects to the conditions and provisions required by the Law now in force providing for the laying out and establishing Public Highways, and that the same be allowed as one of the Public Highways as fully as if it had been four rods wide, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding, and that the Commissioners be and are hereby authorized to erect and establish a Gate near the mouth of the said Road, on the northerly end thereof.
