15 Victoria – Chapter 40 (1851)

An Act in amendment an Act intitled *An Act for the better prevention of Illicit Trade*. Passed 30th April 1851.

- I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, that from and after the passing of this Act, all Wine, Spirits, or other spirituous Liquors, seized, condemned and forfeited, or which may hereafter be seized, condemned and forfeited, under the provisions of an Act made and passed in the eleventh year of the Reign of Her Present Majesty, intituled *An Act for the better prevention of Illicit Trade*, or for breach of any other Act or Law made or to be made relating to the Provincial Revenue in this Province, shall, when so seized, condemned and forfeited, be forthwith, together with the cask or package in which the same was contained, destroyed by direction and under the immediate supervision of the Treasurer or his Deputy, who shall keep an account of the quantity so destroyed, and by whom seized; and the officer or officers seizing the same shall be entitled to receive out of the Revenue of this Province, and from the hands of the Treasurer, a sum of money equal in amount to the duties payable upon a like quantity legally imported.
- II. And be it enacted, that this Act shall not come into operation nor be in force until Her Majesty's Royal approbation thereto be first had and declared.

[This Act was specially confirmed, ratified and finally enacted by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 7th day of August, 1851, and published and declared in the Province the 17th day of September, 1851.]
