15 Victoria – Chapter 57

An Act to simplify the service of Process against Co-Partners in the Trade in proceedings before Justices of the Peace, and in the City Court of Saint John. Passed 7th April 1852.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, that from and after the passing of this Act, in civil actions before Justices of the Peace or in the City Court of Saint John, bought against Co-partners in trade, doing business under the name of a firm, the names of the members composing which may not be set forth in full in the name and style of such firm, it shall be deemed sufficient in any process issued by any Justice of the Peace, or out of the said City Court, in such action or actions to insert the name and style used by the said firm, and such process shall be deemed duly served or executed, if served or executed (as now by law required) upon any member of the said firm doing business in the County in which such process may have been issued, provided that no execution issued upon a judgment obtained upon any such process shall be levied upon other than partnership property.
