16 Victoria – Chapter 49

An Act to authorise the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, of the Parish of Richibucto, to sell certain Lands granted to the said Corporation, and vest the proceeds in other Lands. Passed 3rd May 1853.

Whereas the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Richibucto, are represented to be seized and possessed of certain lands in the Parish of Richibucto, in the County of Kent, situate on the north side of Richibucto River, which are unproductive, and it is deemed desirable to sell and dispose of the same, and to vest the proceeds arising from such sale in other lands for the said Corporation;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows:—

The Rector, Church, Wardens and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Richibucto, by and with the approbation of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell and dispose of, at public auction or private sale, all their right, title and interest to the following described piece of land, situate on the north side of Richibucto, in the County of Kent:— "All that certain piece or lot of land situate on the north side of Richibucto River, in the Parish of Richibucto aforesaid, being all the lot number ten, excepting thereout one hundred acres of land sold to George Kinread, under an Act made and passed in the eleventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to authorise the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, in the Parish of Richibucto, to sell certain Lands granted to the said Corporation, and vest the proceeds in other Lands;"—and to vest the sum so received in other lauds for the use and purpose of a Glebe for the Rector of said Church.
