18 Victoria – Chapter 12

An Act to divide the Shire Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, into two separate Districts for Road and Fire purposes. Passed 3rd April 1855.

Section.

1. Woodstock Parish divided for certain purposes.
2. Moneys levied, where to be expended.

Section.

3. Commissioners of Highways, appointment and election of.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That all that part of the Parish of Woodstock commencing on the northerly side of Lane's Creek, so called, in said Parish, thence southerly along the River Saint John to the lower side of Upham's Creek, so called, in said Parish, and extending hack or westerly from said River one mile, be sun- divided into two separate and distinct parts or districts for road and fire purposes, by a line commencing at the said River Saint John, and at the upper boundary line of land owned and occupied by the late Anthony Baker in his .life time, and running westerly or back from the said River along the said upper boundary line one mile, said parts or districts to be called and known as the upper and lower districts in the said part of the Parish of Woodstock.
2. The moneys assessed, levied, and collected in said districts respectively for road and fire purposes, shall be laid oat and expended in the said districts respectively in which they may he so levied and collected, and not elsewhere.
3. Any two Councillors shall he authorized to appoint one additional Commissioner of Highways for the said lower district for the year one, thousand eight hundred and fifty five; and hereafter one Commissioner of Highways shall be elected or appointed for each of the said districts at the time of the election or appointment of Parish officers.
