An Act to divide the Parish of Carleton, in the County of Kent, into two Parishes. Passed 12th April 1855.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:-

1. All that part of the Parish of Carleton, in the County of Kent, which lies south of the southern side line of the grant of three hundred acres to George Kollock, and its westerly prolongation to the boundary of the said Parish, shall from and after the first day December next be erected into a separate Town or Parish, to be called "The Parish of Palmerston."

2. Any two Justices of the Pence for the said County are hereby authorized to appoint a Town Clerk for the purpose of calling a Parish meeting for the election of Parish officers for the said Parish of Palmerston.

3. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the levying or collecting of any rate heretofore ordered to be assessed on the Parish of Carleton.

4. The General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Kent, are hereby authorized to settle any dispute which may arise between the Pariah of Carleton and the Parish of Palmerston, in relation to any debts or liabilities of the said Parish of Carle ton at the time of the division thereof.
