18 Victoria – Chapter 57

An Act to authorize the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint George's Church in the Parish of Carleton, in the City and County of Saint John, to sell certain lands granted to the said Corporation, and vest the proceeds in other lands or in public securities. Passed 12th April 1855.

Sale of land belonging to Saint George's Church, Carleton, and reinvestment, authorized.

Whereas the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint George's Church, in the Parish of Carleton, in the City and County of Saint John, are seized and possessed of a lot of land, as a Glebe, on the south side of the second Loch Lomond, in the Parish of Simonds, known and distinguished as lot number eleven, in the plan of survey made by Daniel Micheau, Deputy Surveyor, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifteen: And whereas it is deemed desirable to sell and dispose of the same, and vest the proceeds arising from such sale in other lands or in public securities;—

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,— That the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of Saint George's Church, in the Parish of Carleton, in the City and County of Saint John, by and with the approbation of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell all their right, title, and interest in and to the said lot number eleven, on the south side of the second Loch Lomond, in the Parish of Simonds, and to vest the proceeds arising from the sale thereof in the purchase of other lands, for a Glebe for the Rector of the said Church for the time being, or in such public securities as the Lord Bishop may approve, for the use and behoof of the said Rector for the time being.
