26 Victoria – Chapter 20

An Act further to amend the Law relating to Courts of Probate. Passed 20th April 1863.

Whereas doubts have arisen as to the mode of execution of the license to sell the real estate of deceased persons for the purpose of registry, and it is expedient to declare the law in respect thereof;—

Be it therefore declared and enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,—That the acknowledgment and proof of the license to sell real estate, and of a certified copy thereof for the purpose of being registered, mentioned in the fifth Section of the Act of Assembly passed in the twenty fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act in further amendment of the Law relating to Courts of Probate*, shall be deemed to be and shall be as follows:—By the Registrar of the Court acknowledging his signature to such license; and when a copy is required for registry in another County, in like manner acknowledging his signature to the certificate on such copy, before any person authorized by law to take acknowledgments of deeds and conveyances, or by proof of any such signature by any person present at the time of signing the same before any of the authorities aforesaid.
