28 Victoria – Chapter 5

## An Act to amend the Act relating to the Naturalization of Aliens. Passed 3th June, 1865.

Whereas in order to prevent misconception as to the effect of the Act of Assembly made and passed in the twenty fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act relating to the Naturalization of Aliens*, it is deemed advisable that Certificates of Naturalization granted under the said Act should bear on their face an unequivocal announcement of their purely local character;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,—That the Certificate to be transmitted by the Judge before whom the oath is taken and subscribed under the said Act, shall be in the following form, viz:—

L. C. D., Her Majesty's Chief Justice (or one of Her Majesty's Judges, as the case may be) of the
Supreme Court of Judicature of the Province of New Brunswick, do certify, that on the day of
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and, between the hours , of nine and
twelve in the forenoon, in open Court at Fredericton, (or at the Circuit Court of Nisi Prius) holden at
in and for the City and County of Saint John, (or in and for the County of as the case may
be) came and appeared A. B. of [insert the name, residence and occupation of the Alien], and took
and subscribed the oath required by the Act of Assembly 24th Victoria, Chapter 54, intituled An
Act relating to the Naturalization of Aliens, whereby the said A. B. has become entitled to have
and enjoy within the said Province, all the privileges of a natural born subject of Her Majesty.
