CAP. XII.

An ACT to regulate the Rate of Interest in this Island.

[12th June, 1834.]

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to regulate the Rate of Interest to be paid within this Island, in certain cases: Be it enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, of Newfoundland, in Parlia- Preamble. ment assembled, and by the authority of the same, that upon all Debts or Sums certain, payable at a certain time or otherwise, the Jury on the trial of any issue or on any inquisition of damages, may, cent may be charged if they think fit, allow interest to the Creditor, at a rate not exceeding on sums or debts Six Pounds, for the forbearance of One Hundred Pounds for a Year, and due under written so after that Rate for a greater or less sum, or for a longer or shorter time, from the time when such Debts or Sums certain were payable, if such Debts or Sums be payable by virtue of some written Instrument, at a certain time, or if payable otherwise, then from the time when demand of payment shall have been made in writing, so as such demand shall give notice to the Debtor, that Interest will be claimed from the date of such demand, until the time Proviso. of payment; Provided that Interest at the rate of Six per Cent per annum, as aforesaid, shall be payable in all cases arising in this Island, in which Interest is now payable in Law.

II.-And be it further enacted, that no part of the Law of England relating to Usury, or to the amount to be received or taken for the Usury Laws of Eng-land, not in force in Loan or Forbearane of Money, Goods, Wares or Merchandize, shall this leand. be of any force or effect in this Island.

III.—And be it further enacted, thot no claim for Interest, exceed- No claim for Inte. ing Six per Cent per annum, shall be recoverable against any Insol- rest above Six per vent Estate in this Island.
