An ACT for granting to His Majesty certain Monies for defraying the expense of the Civil Establishment of this Colony during the Year Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-**O**ne Five, and for other purposes.

[8th May, 1835.]

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,

VV E, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects the Commons of His Majesty's Island of Newfoundland, in Parliament assembled, having Preamble. freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant to His Majesty a supply to defray certain charges for the Administration of Justice,-the support of the Civil Government of this Island,—and the internal improvement thereof,-do humbly besecch your Excellency that it may be cnacted,—and

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of Newfoundland, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that from and out of such Monies as from time to time shall be and remain in the hands of the Treasurer of this Island, and unappropriated, there shall be granted to His Majesty, his Heirs and Succespriated, there shall be granted to this trajecty, and Leans and Service Pounds, sors, the Sum of Ten Thousand One Hundred and Twelve Pounds, Three Shillings and Three Pence Sterling, which said Sum shall be applied in payment of the following charges for the Year commencing on service of the Year, ending 31st March, 1836. the First Day of April, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-Five, 1836. and ending on the 31st day of March, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-Six, inclusive,-that is to say:

Towards defraying the expenses of importing the Standard Weights and Measures as required by the Act 4th Wm. 4th Cap. 9, One Hundred Pounds.

Towards defraying the expense of the employment of such additional Officers and other Persons as may be necessary for the efficient collection of the Colonial Revenue, Six Hundred Pounds.

Towards compensating James Blaikie Esquire, for the loss of income by the amalgamation of the Office of Clerk of the Central Circuit

And a further Sum of Five Hundred Pounds towards defraying any Unforeseen C casual and extraordinary expenses (not otherwise provided for) which gencies, £500. may arise during the present Year, to be applied under the direction of His Excellency the Governor.

II.—And be it further enacted, that the Sums of Money hereby granted shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Colony in discharge of Monies to be paid by such Warrant or Warrants as shall be issued by the Governor or Per- Warrants on the Treason Administering the Government of the Colony, for the time being, in favor of any Person or Persons, to be applied to the purposes of this Act; And that it shall not be lawful for the said Treasurer to pay any Sum or Sums of Money out of the Treasury of the Colony other than such as are expressed and directed in this or some other Act or Acts of is voted by the Legis-lature. the Legislature of this Colony.

III.—And be it further enacted, that the Third and Fourth Sections of the Act made and passed in the Fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, 3 & 4 Sections, of entituled "An Act for Appropriating the Supplies granted to His re-enacted, Majesty during the present Session of the Colonial Parliament," shall be revived and be and continue in full force and virtue, until the Thirty First Day of March which will be in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-Six, in as full and ample a manner as if the same Sections were herein again contained and re-enacted.
