CAP. VII.

An Act to revive an Act passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth (2nd Session) intituled "An Act to afford relief to Wives and Children deserted by their Husbands and Parents."

[Passed 26th April, 1841.]

HEREAS an Act passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of Preamble. His late Majesty King William the Fourth (Second Session), entitled "An Act to afford relief to Wives and Children deserted by their Husbands and Parants," has expired, and it is expedient and necessary to cap. 8.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, Recited Act revived that from and after the passing of this Act, the said herein-before and continued in force. recited Act, and every matter, clause and thing therein contained, be, and the same are hereby revived, and shall be in as full effect and operation as if the said recited Act, and the several clauses therein contained, were re-enacted.
