CAP. XIII.

An ACT for granting to Her Majesty a sum of Money for defraying the expenses of the Civil Government of the Colony for the year ending the Thirtieth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty_seven, and for other purposes.

[Passed 28th April, 1846.]

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY :---

W E, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Commons of Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto Your Majesty a supply to Pleamble: defray certain charges for the support of the Civil Government, for the administration of Justice, and for the general improvement of the Colony, do humbly beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted, and—

I.—Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, That from and out of such monies as may from time to time remain in the hands of the Treasurer, unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the sum of Nineteen Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty-three £19253 19s. id. Pounds Nineteen Shillings and One Penny, which said sum of money shall be applied granted for purin payment of the following charges for the year commencing on the First day of July, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-six, and ending on the First day of July, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-seven, inclusive, that is to say:—

II.—And be it further enacted, That the said several Sums of Money shall be paid Monies—how by the Colonial Treasurer in discharge of such Warrants as may from time to time be paid. issued by the Governor for such purpose; and that it shall not be lawful for the Treasurer to pay any Monies out of the Colonial Treasury other than such as are granted in this or some other Act of the Legislature.
