CAP. IV.

AN ACT for Regulating the Appropriation of Packet Postage in this Colony.

[Passed 15th June, 1853.]

HEREAS the Income of the Post Office Establishment of this Preamble Colony is insufficient to defray its Expenditure, the same being now paid out of the Revenue of this Island; and whereas it is deemed expedient, in order to aid in the payment of such Expenditure, that a portion of the Packet Postage payable in this Island should be appropriated to that purpose:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened,

I .- That all Packet Postages for Letters shall be One Shilling Sterling Packet Postage of the Half-ounce; Ten Pence of which shall belong to the English Post letters to be 1s. Office, and Two Pence to the Post Office Establishment of this Colony: per half oz; 10d. Provided always, that upon any reduction being made in the present English Post Of-Postage by the Imperial Parliament, a like proportion on the foregoing fice, and 2d. to the Post Office Establishment of this Colony. the Post Office in shall belong to the Post Office Establishment of this Colony.
