CAP. VI.

AN ACT to amend an Act for Consolidating and Amending the Saint John's Rebuilding Acts.

[Passed 15th June, 1853.]

7 HEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend the Fifth and Fiftieth Preamble **VV** Sections of an Act of the Legislature of this Colony passed in the Fifteenth Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled "An Act to consolidate and amend the St. John's Re-building Acts."
