CAP. IX.

AN ACT to provide for the Salary of the Governor of this Island.

[Passed 4th August, 1855.]

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to make provision for the Salary of the Governor of this Island, after the death, resignation or removal of the present Incumbent, according to the means and ability of the People of this Island: Preamble

I.—Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly of Newfoundland, that there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, out of the Public Revenue of this Island, in every Year, the sum of Two Thousand Pounds Sterling, to defray the Salary of any Person who shall hereafter be appointed Governor of this Island and its Dependencies; which said Sum shall be paid Quarterly by Warrant under the hand and seal of the Governor, upon the Receiver General of this Island. £2000 per annum to be granted as Salary to any Governor of this Island hereafter appointed.

II.—When and as soon as the Office of Governor of this Island and its Dependencies shall become vacant, the Act of the Legislature of this Colony, passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to extend and continue certain provisions of an Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom, passed in the second and third years of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth,” shall cease, determine, and stand repealed, so far as the said recited Act provides for the yearly payment of the Salary of the Governor of this Island. On the office of Governor becoming vacant, the Act 6th Vic. Cap. 12, to be partly repealed.

III.—This Act shall not be in force until Her Majesty’s Pleasure shall have been first signified thereon. suspending clause
