CAP. II.

AN ACT to provide for the Erection of a Light House on the Island of Baccalieu, on the Coast of this Island.

[Passed 3rd March, 1857.]

HEREAS it is considered necessary that a Light House should Preamble. be erected on the Island of Baccalieu, on the North Eastern Coast of this Island :

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows :--

It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to expend, out of Governor authorized to erect such Light Dues as shall remain in the hands of the Receiver General, Light House on Baccalieu Island, out of Light Duties. from time to time unappropriated, such Sums of Money as shall be Fund. necessary and available towards the Erection and Support of a Light House on the said Island of Baccalieu, according to the Provisions of an Act of the Legislature, passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act to Authorize the Governor in Council to Erect Light Houses on the Coast of this Colony, and for other purposes."
