## CAP. IX.

> AN ACTfor granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for Defraying the Expenses of the Civil Government of this Colonyfor the Year ending on the 31st day of December," One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven, and for other purposes.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.
May it Please Your Majesty :-

WE, Your Majesty's Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Commons of Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give Preambe. and grant unto Your Majesty a Supply to Defray certain Charges for the support of the Civil Government, for the Administration of Justice, and the General Improvement of this Colony, do hereby beseech Your Majesty that it may be Enacted, and-

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session Convened, That from and out of such Monies as shall from time to time remain in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be granted to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Forty Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Three Pounds Eighteen Shillings and One Penny, which said Sum of Money shall be applied in payment of the following Charges for the Year commencing on the First Day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty. Seven, and ending on the Thirty-First Day of Dacember in the same Year; that is to say:

III. That so much of the sum of Fifty pounds be granted as may be necessary to defray expenditure on Roads by the King's Cove Road Core. Board.
IV. That the Monies hereinbefore granted shall be paid by the Receiver General in discharge of such Warrants as may from time to time be drawn by the Governor for the purposes of this Act; and it shall not be lawful for the Receiver General to pay any Monies out of the Colonial Treasury other than such as are granted ${ }^{9}$ by this Act; or some other Act of the Legislature: Provided, that any sums of Money advanced by the Government of this Colony on account of any of the foregoing appropriations shall be deducted therefrom.
