An Act to Provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature.

[Passed 25th June, 1861.]

HEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Contingent Expenses of Preamble. the Legislature of this Colony:

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened:

That from and out of such Monies as shall from time to time remain in Contingencies 212. The hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Fifteen Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety-three Pounds Six Shillings and Eleven Pence, to be applied towards remunerating the Officers of the Legislature for their Services, and towards defraying the Contingent Expenses of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, as follows:

The sum six thousand five hundred and seventy-five pounds eleven shillings and eight pence to defray the Contingent Expenses of the First Session of the Seventh General Assembly, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, in accordance with the Bill passed in the House of Assembly, on the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty.
