

## Anno Vicesimo-Sexto <br> VICTORIE REGINA.

CAP. XIX.
An Act to Indemnify His Excellency Governor Sir Alexander Bannerman, for certain sums of Money advanced by him from the Colonial Treasury, for the service of the Colony.
[Passed 25th March, 1863.1

WHEREAS it is expedient to Indemnify His Excellency Governor Preamble. Sir Alexander Bannerman, for sums of Money advanced by him from the Colonial Treasury for the Public Service, as is hereinafter detailed.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened :

That from and out of such Moneys as may from time to time remain in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the sum of Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty-seven Pounds and Eighteen Sbillings, to be appropriated as follows-that is to say :

Towards Indemnifying His Excellency Governor Sir Alexander Ban- Indemnity. nerman for the sum of Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred and Fiftyseven Pounds and Eighteen Shillings, advanced by him out of the Colonial Revenue on his own responsibility, and expended by him for the Public Service, as follows:

For Civil and Criminal Prosecutions, one hundred and forty-six trimumal prosecupounds sixteen shillings and nine pence.

For Circuit Courts, one hundred and seventy-five pounds four shil- Cireuit Conts. lings and ten pence.

To Jane Keith, compensātion, five pounds.
To Michael Kearney, on account of International Exhibition, ten pounds.
To Michael J. Kelly, Travelling Expenses, twenty-five pounds. To John Haddon, Travelling Expenses, twenty-five pounds.

The sum of ninety pounds nineteen shillings and five pence to defray Police Clothing. the expense of Police Clothing.

The sum of twenty-three pounds two shillings and four pence, to de- IunaticABylum; fray the expenses of Lunatic Paupers and Repairs of the Lunatic Asylum.

The sum of seven pounds nine shillings and five pence, to defray the Fog Guns. expenses attending the fring of Fog Guns.

The sum of eight pounds two shillings and eight pence, to defray Block Hoses: the expenses of Repairs of Block House.

The sum of ninety-eight pounds three shillings and four pence, to Election Riotr. defray the expense attending the Investigation of Election Riots.
