

CAP. II.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the Twenty-seventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws of the Customs."

[Passed 1st May, 1856.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend an Act passed in the Twenty-seventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws of the Customs."

Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened:

I.—So much of the thirty-first section of the hereinbefore recited Act as permits a Bond to be given for the payment of Duties on Wines, Spirits, unrefined Sugar, and Tobacco, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

27 Vic. Cap. 2, sec. 31, repealed as permits Bonds for Spirits, Sugar, and Tobacco.

II.—No Spirits, (except from Europe, the British West Indies, or the British Possessions in North America), shall be imported into this Island or its Dependencies, or be carried coastwise from one port to any other port thereof, in any cask, or other vessel capable of containing Liquors, not being of the size or contents of Thirty Gallons, at least, instead of Fifty Gallons, as mentioned in the sixty-third section of the hereinbefore recited Act; but the said section shall otherwise apply and be in force.

No Spirits, &c., to be imported in casks less than 30 gallons each.
