

*Laws of Her Majesty's Province of Newfoundland*, passed in the year 1839.

3 Victoria – Chapter 10

**An Act for granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for defraying the Expenses of the late Delegation. (Passed 12th October, 1839.)**

Whereas it is necessary to grant unto Her Majesty a Sum of Money to provide for the Expenses attendant upon a Delegation from the House of Assembly of this Island, to treat with Her Majesty's Government in London on matters connected with this Colony.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of Newfoundland, in General Assembly convened, that there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, to be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this Colony, the Sum of Seven Hundred and Thirteen Pounds Eight Shillings and Twopence—

To His Excellency the Governor, to be appropriated by three Commissioners to be appointed by the House of Assembly,—as follows,—

Fees of Counsel, in the Case of Henry John Boulton, Two Hundred and Fifteen Pounds Ten Shillings and Threepence; to William Witham, Solicitor, as per Bill of Costs, Two Hundred and Nineteen Pounds Ten Shillings and Sixpence; for Printing, Forty-four Pounds Six Shillings and Sixpence; for reporting in the Case of Henry John Boulton, Forty-five Pounds Eleven Shillings and Eightpence Halfpenny; paid for Lithographing, by the Speaker, Two Pounds Nine Shillings and Fourpence; paid for Printing, by Patrick Morris, Esquire, Twenty-eight Pounds Nine Shillings and Tenpence Halfpenny; Expenses of John V. Nugent, One Hundred and Fifty-seven Pounds Ten Shillings.
