

Laws of Her Majesty's Province of Newfoundland, passed in the year 1845.

8 Victoria – Chapter 16

An Act to provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature during the present Session. (Passed 23rd April, 1845.)

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, In Legislative Session convened, that from and out of such monies as may from time to time remain in the hands of the Treasurer, unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the sum of Three Thousand One Hundred and Sixty-eight Pounds Nineteen Shillings and Ten Pence, to be appropriated towards remunerating the Officers of the Legislature for their services, and towards defraying the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature during the present Session, as follows, that is to say:

To the Honorable the Speaker of the General Assembly, the sum of Two Hundred Pounds.

To the Usher of the Black Rod, Seventy Pounds.

To the Clerk of the General Assembly, and for indexing and super-intending the Printing of the Journals, Two Hundred Pounds.

To the Clerk Assistant, One Hundred Pounds.

To the Solicitor of the General Assembly, One Hundred and Fifty Pounds.

To the Chairman of the Committee of Supply, Fifty Pounds.

To the Sergeant at Arms, One Hundred Pounds.

To the Door Keeper, Forty-Five Pounds.

To the Messenger, Forty Pounds.

To the Assistant Messenger, Thirty-five Pounds.

To the Under-doorkeeper, Thirty-five Pounds.

To the Assistant Door-keeper, Messenger and Attendant, Twenty-five Pounds.

To the Librarian, Twenty-five Pounds.

To the House-keeper, Twenty Pounds.

To Twenty-one Members of the General Assembly (the Speaker not included) being Forty-two Pounds each for Fifteen Members resident in St. John's, and Sixty-three Pounds each for Six Out-port Members not resident in St. John's, One Thousand and Eight Pounds.

To the Clerk of the General Assembly, to defray the Contingent Expenses of his Office, pursuant to the Report of the Select Committee on Contingencies, Seventy-one Pounds Ten Shillings and Eight Pence.

To the Sergeant at Arms to defray the Contingent Expenses of his Office, pursuant to the Report of the Select Committee aforesaid, Ninety-four Pounds and Three Pence.

To the Proprietors of the Newfoundlander, Newspaper, being the balance due for printing the Journals of last Session, One Hundred and Forty-seven Pounds Eleven Shillings and Eight Pence, and for printing the Journals of the present Session, One Hundred and Fifty Pounds.

To Messrs, Ryan & Withers, for printing Bills and Papers during the present Session, Three Hundred and Two Pounds Seventeen Shillings and Three Pence.

To the Proprietors of the Times, Morning Post, Courier, Morning Advertiser, and Patriot, Newspapers, for Reporting the Debates during the present Session, Two Hundred Pounds.

Towards purchasing Books for the Library of the Legislature) One Hundred Pounds.
