9 Victoria – Chapter 3 (Session 1)

An Act to Regulate the Culling of Cod-fish in this Colony. (Passed 28th April, 1846.)

Whereas it is expedient to regulate the Culling of Cod-fish in this Colony.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, That from and after the passing of this Act, it shall not be lawful for any person to Cull any quantity of Cod-fish within this Colony unless such person shall have previously taken and subscribed before a Stipendiary Justice of the Peace the Oath hereinafter mentioned: Provided always that it shall and may be lawful in all cases where the purchasers and sellers of Cod-fish may agree to employ an unsworn Culler.

SCHEDULE.

I, A. B., do swear that I will faithfully and without fear, favor, or affection, discharge the duties of a Fish Culler.
