

*Laws of Her Majesty's Province of Newfoundland*, passed in the year 1850.

13 Victoria – Chapter 3

**An Act to amend an Act entitled “An Act to amend several Acts now in force respecting Light-Houses, and to make further provision for the said Light-Houses, and to consolidate the Laws respecting the same.” (Passed 30th April, 1850.)**

Whereas it is expedient to amend an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled “An Act to amend several Acts now in force respecting Light Houses, and to make further provision for the said Light Houses, and to consolidate the Laws respecting the same.”—

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly of Newfoundland, in Legislative Session convened, that from and after the passing of this Act, there shall be raised, levied, collected and paid, to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, upon every Merchant Ship or Vessel entering any Port within this Island from Cape Ray to Cape John, (other than Coasting, Sealing and Fishing Vessels,) a Duty or Rate of Six Pence Sterling per ton, for every ton register measurement of each respective Vessel as aforesaid, instead and in lieu of Three Pence per ton upon every such Vessel, imposed by the said Act: Provided, that such Duty shall not be levied upon any such Ship or Vessel more than once in each instead of twice in each year, as provided for by the said Act, with respect to the Rate or Duty therein imposed.

II. And be it enacted, That the Board of Controul of Light-Houses shall, on the First Day of July after the passing of this Act, furnish to the Governor for the time being, an estimate of the probable charges and incidental expenses attendant upon carrying out the provisions of the said recited Act, up to the Thirty-first day of December following, and also shall, on the First day of January ensuing, and on the same day in each year, for the purpose of being laid before the Legislature, furnish an estimate, as aforesaid, for the current year thence ensuing.

III. And be it enacted, That the Duty by this Act imposed shall (except as hereinbefore provided for) be raised, levied, collected, paid, applied and appropriated under the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any Act in amendment thereof.
