

 γ HEREAS it may be necessary for the complete operation of the treaty of amity, commerce and navigation, concluded between his Majefty and the United States of America, and figned at London, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, to repeal fuch acts or ordinances as might be confirmed to impede the free intercoufe between his Majefty's fubjects and the citizens of the United States, ftipulated by the faid treaty, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesiy, by and with the advice and confent of the legiflative council and affembly of the province of Upper-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an act paffed in the parliament of Great-Britain, entitled "An act to repeal certain parts of an act palled in the fourteenth year of his Majefty's reign, entitled, " An act for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America. and to make further provision for the government of the faid province," and by the authority of the fame. That from and after the paffing of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the governor, lieutenant-governor or perfon administering the government of this province, by and with the advice and confent of his Majefiy's executive council, by order or orders, to be from time to time illued and published to fuspend the operation of the whole, or any part or parts of any act, or acts, or ordinance, or ordinances that may impede, or may be confirued to impede the free intercourfe flipulated by the faid treaty between his Majefty's fubjects, and the citizens of the United States.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That this act shall continue, and be in force two years and no longer.



An ACT for the better Division of the County of Prince-Edward into Townships.

Preamble.

W HEREAS the inhabitants of the townships, of Marysburg and Sophiasburg, in the county of Prince-Edward experience many difficulties from the uncommon length of the faid townships. Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the legislative council and assembly of the province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an ast passed in the parliament of Great-Britain, entitled " An ast to repeal certain parts of an ast passed
