Cletk's fees.

And the clerk of the peace shall be entitled to receive the sum of five shillings, and no more, for the said certificate.

Certificate to be enregistred. III. Provided nevertheless, That nothing in this act contained shall be taken to but any perfon of dower, unless the said certificate shall within six months after the making of the same, be duly enregistered according to the provisions of an act passed in the thirty-sisth year of his majesty's reign, entitled "An act for the public registering of deeds, conveyances, wills, and other incumbrances, which shall be made, or may effect any lands, tenements, or hereditaments within this province."

C H A P. VIII.

An ACT to supply the want of Enrollment of Deeds of Bargain and Sale.

Preamble.

HEREAS in certain cases, lands have been intended to have been conveyed by deed of bargain and fale; and whereas fuch deeds of bargain and fale not having been enrolled in a court of record, are not valid in law; in order therefore to prevent the injury that might hence arise to his majesty's subjects in this province, and for the better regulating the conveyance of land in future; Be it enacted by the king's most excellent majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the legislative council and affembly of the province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an act passed in the parliament of Great-Britain, entitled " An act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, " An act for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the faid province," and by the authority of the same, That wherever any lands have been fold, or shall hereafter be fold under deed of bargain and fale, and fuch deed of bargain and fale hath been, or shall heseafter be duly enregistered in the register office of the county in which such lands are situate, agreeably to the provisions of an act passed in the thirty-fifth year of his majesty's reign, entitled, "An act for the public registering of deeds, conveyances, wills and other incumbrances which shall be made, or may effect any lands, tenements, or hereditaments within this province," the same shall be, and is hereby declared to be a good and valid conveyance in law.

Deeds of fale to lands fold, or to be fold, that have been, or hereafter shall be enregistered igreably to the act of 35th of Geo. 3 i declared valid.
