WHEREAS the provisions of an ordinance passed in the twenty-sith year of the reign of his present Majesty, entitled "An Ordinance concerning advocates, attornies, solicitors, and notaries, and for the more easy collection of his Majesty's revenues," have been so far as the same relates to notaries, sound inconvenient and inapplicable to this province, Be it enasted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Countries and Assembly of the province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an ast passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An ast to repeal certain parts of an ast passed in the four-teenth year of his Majesty's reign, entitled "An ast for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America, and to make surther provision for the government of the faid province," and by the authority of the same, That the same shall be, and hereby is, so far as it relates to Notaries, repealed.
