An ACT to continue an Act, entitled, " An Act for fecuring the Titles to Lands in this Province."

WHEREAS an act passed in the thirty-feventh year of the reign of his prefent Majefty, entitled, "An act for fecuring the titles to lands in this province," will expire on the first day of June next; and whereas many of the inhabitants of this province have not yet been; nor will be able to participate in the benefits of the faid act before the time limitted for the expiration thereof. Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majefty, by, and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the province of Upper Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an act paffed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, entitled, "An act to repeal certain parts of an act paffed in the fourteenth year of his Majefty's reign, entitled, "An act for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the faid province," and by the authority of the fame, That the faid act be, and it hereby is continued for, and during the further term of two years, and from thence to the end of the then next fession of the Provincial Parliament.
