commence from the first day of the fession in which such A& is passed : And whereas the fame is liable to produce great and manifest injustice : For remedy thereof, Be it enacled by the King's most excellent Majesty by and with the advice and content of the Legiflative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, conftituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled an Act to repeal certain parts of Act paffed in the fourteenth year of his Majefty's reign, entitled an A& for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the faid Province, and by the authority of the fame, That the Secretary of this Province shall endorse on every Act of the Legislature of this Province which shall pass during the present and every future festion thereof. immediately after the title of fuch Act, the day month and year, when the fame fhall have passed and received the Royal affent, and fuch indorfement shall be taken to be a part of such A&, and to be the date of its commencement where no other commencement (ball be therein provided.

C H A P. XII-

An ACT for granting to his Majefly a certain fum of Money out of the Provincial Fund, to defray the Payment of the Salaries of the Officers of the Legislative Council and House of Assimily (including the Commissioners to Lower Canada) and to defray the Contingent Expences thereof; and further to appropriate the Supplies and provide for the Payment of the fame hereaster. [July 9th, 1801.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

I. W E your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal fubjects the Commons of Upper Canada in Parliament affembled, to defray the payment of the Salaries of the Officers of the Legislative Council and House of Affembly, and for defraying the Contingent Expences thereof, as well as to defray the payment of the Commiffioners to Lower Canada, have refolved to give and grant unto your Majefty out of the rates and duties already raifed, levied and collected, and hereafter to be raifed, levied or collected, the fum hereafter mentioned, and do most humbly befeech your Majefty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majefty by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, confituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "an Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majefty's reign, entitled "an Act for mak-

ing more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province, and by the authority of the fame, That from and out of the rates and duties already railed, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raifed, levied and collected, to and for the purposes of paying the Salaries of the Officers of the Legislative Council and House of Affembly, and for defraying the Contingent Expences thereof, and to and for the uses of this Province, there be granted to his Majesty the sum of two thousand two hundred and fifty five pounds five shillings, to be issued out of the Provincial Fund in the Receiver General's hands to the uses hereaster expressed, and defray the following expences, that is to say,

For Services rendered previous to the prefent Sellion of Parliament as follows : The Clerk of the Legiflative Council, one hundred and forty-five pounds.

The Malter in Chancery attending the Legislative Council, fifty pounds.

The Chaplain of the Legislative Council, thirty pounds.

The Door-keeper of the Legislative Council, twenty pounds.

The Speaker of the Houfe of Affembly, two hundred pounds.

The late Cierk of the Houle of Affembly for two years falary due, three hun-, dred pounds.

The Serjeant at Arms, fifty pounds.

To the fame for the contingent expences of the Houle of Affembly, five pounds fifteen thillings.

The Chaplain of the Houfe of Affembly, thirty pounds.

The Door-keeper of the House of Affembly, twenty pounds.

Punting the heads of a Bill relative to the carrying place at Niagara, four pounds ten fhillings.

The two Commissioners to Lower Canada, one hundred pounds each, two hundred pounds.

For the fervices of the prefent fellion as follows :

The Clerk of Legislative Council, one hundred and twenty-five pounds.

II. And be it further enacted, That there be granted annually to his Majefty. Future applicaout of the rates and duties aforefaid, to be iffued out of the Provincial Treafury from fuch monies as may from time to time come into the Receiver General's hands, the fum of one thousand and ninety pounds to and for the uses hereafter expressed, and to defray the following expences, that is to fay, feven hundred and forty pounds for the payment of the Salaries of the Officers of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, as recited in the detail for the Service of the prefent Selfion, and three hundred and fifty pounds for the payment of Copying Clerks and the Printing of the Laws and Journals.

III. And be it further enacted, That the monies hereby granted to his Majefly shall be paid by the Receiver General in discharge of fuch warrant or warrante as shall for the purposes herein set forth be from time to time issued by his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or perfon administering the Government of this Province for the time being, and not otherwife ; and the faid Receiver General shall account to his Majesty for the fame through the Commissioners of his Majefty's Treasury for the time being in such manner and form as his Majefty thall direct.
