## CHAP. IX.

## An AE for the further encouragement of the Growth and Cultivation of Hemp within this Province, and for the Exportation threef.

Paffed 16th March, 1808.

7HEREAS by an act of the parliament of this Province, made and paffed in the forty-fifth year of his Majelty's reign, entitled " an act for granting to his Majefty a certain fum of money for the encouragement of the Growth and Cultivation of Hemp in this Province, and the exportation thereof," it was amongft other things enacted, that the fum of fify pounds fhould be the rate or price to be paid per ton for Hemp which may be purchafed under or by virtue of the faid act; and whereas it is found by experience that the faid fum of fifty pounds per ton is infufficient to compensate for the labour of the cultivators of Hemp in this Province; for the further encouragement thereof, Be it therefore enacted by the King's molt excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act paffed in the fourteenth year of his Majefty's rei. n, intituled "an Act formaking more effectual provision for the government the Province of Quebec in North America, & to make further provision for the government of the faid Province," and by the authority of the lame; That the fum of fixty-two pounds and ten shillings per ton shall be the rate or price for good & merchantable Hemp which may be hereafter purchased under and by virtue of this act or any former act of the parliament of this Province, any law or ulage to the contrary in any wife notwithstanding.

CHAP.X.

An AEt to continue an Act passed in the forty-fifth year of his Majesty's reign, entitled "an Act to afford relief to those perfons who may be entitled to claim Lands in this Province, as Heirs or Devises of the Nominees of the Crown, in cases where no patent hath issued for such Lands, and surther to extend the benefits of the faid AEt.

Paffed 16th March, 1808.

WHEREAS an act paffed in the forty-fifth year of his Majelty's reign, entitled "an act to afford relief to those perfons who may be entitled to claim lands in this Province, as heirs or devises of the nominees of the Crown, in cases where no patent hath illued for fuch lands," will shortly expire, and it is expedient to continue the faid act, and further to extend the benefits thereof; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legissative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled.
