Preamble.

HEREAS under the Provisions of an Act passed in the fifty fourth year of His Maiesty's Reign antifled "on Act to record to the fifty fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled " an Act to repeal part of the Laws now in force for raising and training the Militia of this Province, and to make further and more effectual provision for the same," several Inspectors of Districts within this Province, have advanced money to divers individuals for certain Certificates which they held for the performance of Team work in His Majesty's Services for the apprehension of certain deserters and other militia services, Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, entitled "an Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "an Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That out of the Rates and Duties already raised, levied, and
