Appropriation of Penalties.

VII. And he it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. His Heirs and Successors may be graciously pleased to direct.

Surplus of the sum remain at the disposal of Parliament.

VIII. And he it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That so much of hereby granted to the said sum of Seventy Five Pounds as shall remain unexpended under the provisions of this Act shall be at the disposition of the Provincial Parliament: any thing in this Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
