CHAP. VIII.

An Act to Provide for Constructing a Navigable Canal between Burlington Bay and Lake Ontario.

[Passed 19th March, 1823.]

Preamble.

HEREAS a Canal Navigable for Vessels between Burlington Bar in the District of Gore, and Lake Ontario, would tend to promote the general interest of this Province, and particularly that part of the Country contiguous thereto: And whereas it is expedient to raise a sum of money by way of Loan to make and complete the said Canal, the annual interest on which to be paid from a fund to be raised and collected by a foll to be levied on Goods, Produce, and all other articles as well as Vessels and other craft passing in or through the same, and also to establish a fund for the redemption of the said Loan, Be it therefore enacted by the king's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entituded "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entituled - An Act for making more effectual provision for the Covernment of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor. Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, so soon after the passing of this Act as he may deem expedient, to authorise and direct His Majesty's Receiver General of this Province to raise by Loan from any person or persons, bodies corporate or politic. who may be willing to advance the same upon the credit of the Government Bills or Debentures authorised to be issued under this Act, a sum of money not exceeding Five Thousand-Pounds, to make and complete the said Canal, and also such works as may be deemed necessary to protect and secure the entrance thereof, as wellfrom Burlington Bay as from Lake Ontario.

An Act to make additional Provision for the Improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province.

[Passed March 19th, 1823.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the second year of Your Majesty's Reign, entituled "An Act to make provision for the improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province," by which the sum of two thousand pounds was granted for the purpose of obtaining Surveys, Plans, and Estimates for improving the Inland Navigation of this Province; and whereas it is expedient to provide additional means for the said purpose, we, Your
