CHAP. IX.

An Act to make additional Provision for the Improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province.

[Passed March 19th, 1823.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the second year of Your Majesty's Reign, entituled "An Act to make provision for the improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province," by which the sum of two thousand pounds was granted for the purpose of obtaining Surveys, Plans, and Estimates for improving the Inland Navigation of this Province; and whereas it is expedient to provide additional means for the said purpose, we, Your

Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and upder the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entituled. An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entituled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the rates and duties raised, levied, and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, to and for the public uses of this Province, and in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there he granted to His Majesty the sum of one thousand pounds, which said sum of one thousand pounds shall be in aid of The additional sum the said sum of two thousand pounds, and shall, with the residue thereof, be of £1000 granted applied towards the payment of any expences that may be incurred under in aid of the funds the provisions of the said first recited Act.
