the Justices of the Peace:-Be it therefore Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the tenth cluuse of the said Act, in so far as relates to the same, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed; And that the Treasurer of each and every District of this rovince shath, after the passing of this Act, pay to the order of the Magistrates, in Special Sessions of the Peace, in the month of March, in their respertive divisions assembled, of any other Special Sessions within the divisions where sach land is situated, all sueh sum or sums of money as may have been paid in or collected for whe said rate of one-eighth of a penny per annum, to be by the said Justices of the Peace laid out, by contract or otherwise, to the best advantage on the High-ways within the Township where the land lies from which the said rate was paid or collected.

## CHAP. X.

aiN aCT to Repeal part af, and Amend an Act passed in the fiftieth year of His Late Majesty's Reign antitleds GIn Aet to Provide for the Laying Out, Amending, and Keeping in Repair, the Paillic Highioays and Roads in this Province, and to Repeal the Lazos mowe in force for that purpose " "ond also to Repelat part of, and Amend the Provisions of an atct passed in the fiftyminth year of His Late Majesty's Reign, entitted, "Ann tet to Repeal part of, and Hmend the Liuos nowin force for Laying Oat, Ameuding, and Keep. ing in Repaiv the Public Highways and Roads in this Province"
[Passed Jan 19th, 1824.]

WHFREAS it is expedient to repeal part of, and amena an Act passed in the fiftietli year of His Late Majesty's Reign, enfitled,


10th . clause 5914 Geo III. ch. 8th, as far as relates th the payment of money by Trea-urerto Overseers repealed.

Treasurer shall pay to the order of the Magistrates in Ses. sions, in the month of March, all such money as may bave been collected by the rate of: 15 of $1 d$. per annom.
Such money so paid bow to be laid out.'
"An Act for the Laying Out, Amending, and Keeping in Repairgs the Public High-ways and Roads in this Province, and to Repeal the Laws now in force for that purpose; "nd also to extend the provisions of the said Act, and also to repeal part of and amend the provisions of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Aet to repeal part of, and amend the Laws now in force for Laying Out, Amending, and Keeping in Repair the Public High-ways and Roads in this Province:

BEIT THEREFORE ENACTED by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-: lative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper.Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the anthority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to Repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act för making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in Iresth America, and to make further Provision for the Government:

5th clause 30th Geo. III. ch. 1st.

Gth clause 50ih reco. III. ch. 8th, repealed.

No road under 50th Geo. III cls 1. to be more than 66, or less lhan 40 feet in width.

- This not to affect any road now established under the said Act.

If any road shall be fitered, the new one shall $n \wedge t$ be less in width than the old. of the said Province,'" and by the authority of the same;-That the fifth clause of the said recited Act, and the sixth clause of the said last mentioned Act be; and the same are laereby; repealed.
11. And be it further Enacted by the "athority aforesaid, That: no road hereafter to be laid out under the provisionsof the said first recited Act shall be more than sixty-six, nor less thanforty. feet in the width :-Proviled alvays nevertheless, That notling in. this clause contained shall extend; or be construed to estend,to affect any road now established under the pravision of the said recited Act.
III. Provided alxays newertheless, And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when any Road now or hereafter es-
tablished, shall be altered, it shall not be lawful for the Surveyor of Roads reporting such alteration, to lay out such New Road of alesswidth than the one proposed to be altered.
IV. And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty's Justiees of the Peace, at their Special Sessions; in the month of March in each and every year, or at any General Quarter Sossions of the Peace, upon application in writing, signed by at least Twelve Freeholders residing in any Town, Township, or place, of this Province, requesting permission to lay out and apply part of tlie Statute Labour of such Town, Township, or place, on the high-ways and roads of any adjoining Town, Township, or place, for the said Justices, so assembled, to permit the same when it shall appear manifestly advantageous to the inhabitants making such application, in such proportion as to the majority of the said Justices then and there present may seem meet.

## V. Ind bè it fürther Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That

 when any person or persons liabie to the rate of one-eighth of a penyy per acre on land, for the purposes of the high-ways, shall lay out any money on roads in the Town, Township, or place where the same is situated, or cause labonr to be done thereon, the approbation of the Justices of the Peace, or the majority of them, assembled in any General QuarterSessions for the Distint in which such land is situated, having been first obtained, it shall and may be lawful for the Justices, or the niajority of them, so assembled at any subsequent Sessions, when application shall be made for that purpose, if it shall appear to them, or the majority of them, that the same has been judiciously laid out, and manifestly for the puiblic adrantage, by their order to the Treasurer of such District, the amoutito be set off and allowed against any arrears that may laveJastices of the Feace in March in each year or İ: General Quarter Sessians, by application in writing, nigned by at least 12. Fresholders of any Town, may appls part of the statute labour of such Towr on any Highveays adjoining it if it shoul apjear advautagenus, io sinch pro. portion as the majority.may think fit.

When eng' person= liable to 18 of 1d. pes acre shall expend any money on roadsin the towi, where the same is situated or catse it to be dune, the ap probstion of the nujority of the Jastices in any:Generat Quarter Sesions having been obtained; the sairl Justice, upon application in any subsequient Seosions, if it appearthai the same has réed laid out 10 ndvantage, to order thefTreastarer lo set UHI the mouat against auy arrears that may have or may accrue ousaid Laeds, or such part as may apuearexpended for the gond of the Town nhere itise situated. alreaty accrued, or may hereafter accrue, on the saiu lands, or snele part thereof as may to them appear to have been expended for the general good of the Town, Township, or place where the same is situated.

Wben application is made where any road laid ut or altered, tbose making it (after sale of old road and proceeds praid to the owner of the new) shall be liable to pay any sum which a Juy as tiy Law directed shall ascertain it the owner or agent \&ec. shall withits 3 months from the date of the repoirt of such New Road \&c. make appli cation for comprensation ancording to law, no order shall issue for statute labour to be performed unless a discharge \&c. be taken from the owner \&c. or proof of tender of the value so ascertained. be procerded to General Quarter Sessions.

Ind be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in all cases when application shall be made to any Survey or or Surreyors of the High-ways, to have any New Road laid out, or any, Road alr-ady laid out altered, those making the application, (after a sale of the Old Road, so altered, shall have taken place, and the proceeds of such sale been paid over to the owner of the land through which the New Road may pasig) shall be deemed liable to pay any further sum, which stall be ascertained by a Jury, in manner as by the laws now in force is directed; and in case the owner or owners, agent or agents thereof shall, within three months fron the date of the report of such New Road, or the alteration of such Road or Roads, make application to be compensated for the laud taken for the same, in manner as by the laws now in force is directed. no order shall issue directing Statute Labour thereon, unkess a discharge or acquittal for the sane, or release for the land taken for such purpose from the owner or owners thereof, or proof of a tender having been made for the value thereaf, so aseertained, be produced to the General Quarter Sessions-Provided wevertheleos, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the said Justiees of the Peacefrom directing the same to be paid out of the public money of the Bistrict. it to then it shall appear that the said alteration is of manitest utility to the public at large, and not of a local nature.

VH. And whereas much inconvenience thas arisen by the sale of portions of the origital Government appropriationsandahowsances for High-ways and Hoads in the iseveral Hownships tin this Lere
vince :-Be it therefore Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the ninth clause of the Act passed by the Legislature of this ProFince in the fiftieth year of the Reign of His Late Majesty, King George the Third, entitled, "An Act to Provide for the Laying Out, Amending, and Keeping in Repair the Public High-ways and Roads in this Province, and to Repeal the Laws now in force for, that purpose," be Repealed, and the same is hereby Repealed, so far as regards the aforesaid Government appropriations for such High-ways and Roads-Provided alvoays, That nothing in this Clause cortained shall restrain any Surveyor of High-ways from Selling and Conveying any Road which he is now by Law authorised to Sell and Convey.
VIII. And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That any person liable to perform the duty imposed by this, or any other Law now in foree, may compound for such duty, if he or she may think fit, by paying to the Overseer the sum of Five Shillings for each Cart or Waggon-Teañ, and Driver, for each day; and every person liable to perform such labonr may compound for the same, if he or she should think fit, by paying to the Overseer the sum of Two shilings and Sixpence, for and in lieu of such day's duty or labour respectively, at the time, and in the mancer directed by Law:
