and Profits arising therefrom shall be paid into the hands of His Majesty's Receiver General, to and for the public uses of this Province, at the disposition of the Legislature thereof, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct. Provided always, that the said Harbour shall be commenced within One Year, and completed within Seven Years after the passing of this Act, otherwise this Time for commencing Act, and every matter and thing herein contained, shall cease and be up terly null and void.

AN ACT to provide for the guiding line in the Township of Lancaster. in the Eastern District.

WHEREAS by the third clause of an Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, "An Act to repeal an Ordinance of the Province of Quebec, passed in the twenty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Ordinance concerning Land Surveyors, and the admeasurement of Lands, and also to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act to ascertain and establish on a permanent footing, the Boundary Lines of the different Townships of this Province, and further to regulate the manner in which Lands are hereafter to be surveyed,"" it is enacted, that the Boundary Line of each and every Township, on that side from which the Lots are numbered, shall be the course or courses of the respective division or side lines throughout the several Townships and Concessions of this Province, respec-. tively: And whereas the side Lines of Lots in the Township of Lancaster, in the Eastern District, were not originally run parallel to the Easter were not originally tern Boundary of the said Townships from which the Lots are numberrun parallel to the Eastern Boundary of ed, and great difficulty and inconvenience would arise to the Inhabitants of the said Townships by having their side lines or limits between lots, run pursuant to the said Act.
