be kept properly lighted during the continuance of the navigation in each year, and that no Light-House Keeper shall be entitled to receive any salary of keeper portion of his salary during any half year in which he shall have ne-not kept up. glected to keep the Lamps under his charge lighted, throughout any night during the period in which the said Inspector General shall direct the same to be lighted.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the mo-Monies how paid and nies authorized to be expended under this Act shall be accounted for to accounted for, His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors may please to direct.

CHAP. XXXVI.

AN ACT granting a Sum of Money to defray the expense of crecting a Light-House on Nine Mile Point, at the entrance of the Harbour of Kingston.

[Passed 13th February, 1833.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

WHEREAS it is necessary, for the security of vessels navigating Preamble. Lake Ontario, that a Light House should be erected on a Point called Nine Mile Point, at the entrance of the Harbour of Kingston, in the Midland District: We beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That there be granted to His Majesty, from and out of the rates and duties levied and col-£750 granted to lected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, and in the hands erection of a of the Receiver General unappropriated, the sum of Seven Hundred Light-House on and Fifty Pounds, to be applied towards the erection and completion of

a Light-House on a Point called Nine Mile Point, at the entrance of the Harbour of Kingston, in the Midland District.

Commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of the Light-House.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That John Macaulay, John Marks, and Hugh Christopher Thomson, Esquires, be Commissioners to contract for, and superintend the erection and completion of the said Light-House.

Money how paid and accounted for,

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of money hereby granted shall be paid by the Receiver General, in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as may be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be pleased to direct.

CHAP. XXXVII.

AN ACT to defray the expenses of keeping a Light at the Burlington Canal, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

[Passed 13th February 1833.]

WHEREAS it is necessary to provide a sum of Money for the purpose of keeping a Light or Lights on the Pier or Piers at the entrance of the Burlington Bay Canal, at the head of the Lake Ontario, and to pay the salary of a person to keep the said Light, and to attend the Bridge erected across the entrance of the said Canal: Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and
