WHEREAS it is necessary to alter and amend the provisions of An Act passed in the last Session of the Provincial Parliament, entitled "An Preamble Act to incorporate certain Persons under the style and title of the President, Directors and Company, of the Commercial Bank of the Midland District:—Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government
